Explicit Instruction. We have observed that the implementation of the strategy happens smoothly when the level of support is scaffolded. The teacher supports are greater and student responsibility is low. As students demonstrate an increased understanding of the intended learning outcomes, teachers are able to adjust their instructional supports by decreasing the amount of scaffolding they provide to students.
