1-Math By June 2025, the percentage of students who score proficient or distinguished will increase by 5 percentage points on MCAP Mathematics from 3.54 % to 8.54 %. This requires 66 or more students to score proficient or distinguished on MCAP Mathematics.	Despite the availability of resources for multilingual learners, many educators lack the awareness and training to integrate them effectively into their teaching. To address this, our math educators will participate in coaching sessions led by the Instructional Lead Teacher. These sessions will equip them with targeted strategies tailored to the needs of multilingual learners, which they will incorporate into their weekly lesson plans.		
2-RELA/ELA By June 2025, the percentage of students who score proficient or distinguished will increase by 3-5% on MCAP ELA from 29.67% to 32.67%. This requires (253) or 23 more students to score proficient or distinguished on MCAP ELA.	Intentional lesson planning: active modeling, vulnerability, CER through RACES. Lesson plans were essentially copies of the curriculum with no personalization/customization for the specific classes or populations of student participants. The change idea for intentional lesson planning is twofold: first, to capture specific curricular modifications, and second, to capture active modeling of CER through RACES.		
3-Attendance By June 2025, the percentage of students who are chronically absent will decrease by 5 percentage points per the Business intelligence Report from 31% to 26%. This will targeted support of approximately 20 students (MLs and/or SWDS) reducing the chronically absent rate for both groups.	During mod 1, the Attendance Secretary will identify and notify the teacher of record of missing attendance with targeted attention to co-taught, supported inclusion, and ESOL classes.
