

- Food Insecurity is prevalent

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice



- Increase access for more participation in extended learning programs and experiences to include expansion of offerings
- Expansion of additional STEM related offerings for elementary and middle school students
- Expansion of opportunities for students to participate in robust experiential learning experiences outside of the classroom
- Expansion of collaboration and meeting communication
- Increased professional development and training for leaders in ACEs, trauma-informed practices and leadership development
- Integrated Systems of Support



- Expanded opportunities to implement interventions at every grade level and content areas within the school
- Ongoing professional development and learning community centered around best practices for interventions
- Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



- Build upon rapport and strengthen existing partnerships with parents and school staff
