

What did we learn?





- 57% of students feel they can talk honestly with adults at school
- 46% of students either always or sometimes feel included (staff helpful/ info provided in home language, etc)



Staff Feedback

➤ 89% More than three-quarters reported that their schools have the supports for students struggling with academics (90.0%), attendance (87.5%), and behavior (80.0%).

Family Feedback

- 81% of families feel their school welcomes everyone; Staff= 95%
- 63% of families feel the school communicates with them in a way they understand.




Priorities and Opportunities
