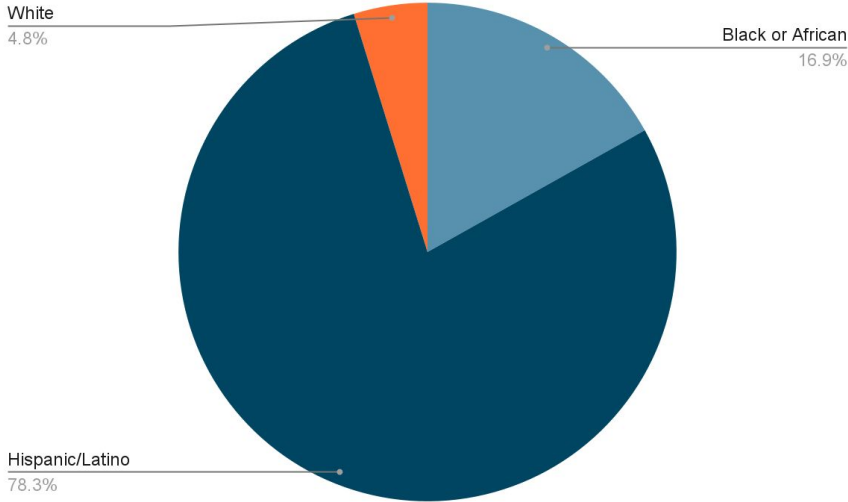
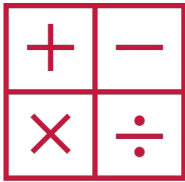

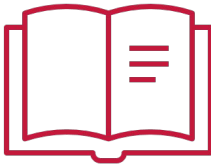

What did we learn?



Student Feedback

- Around one-third indicate need for help with emotional problems.
- Mixed feelings about culture being reflected in education; less than 20% say "always."
- Many see some connection between school learning and life outside, but "sometimes" is the most common response.



Staff Feedback

- Frequent use of learning management systems and email; rare use of social media for communication.
- Generally positive view of school climate; most believe students sometimes see their culture reflected.
- Staff report higher perceived student needs (emotional support, healthcare, food, clothing) than students/families do.

Family Feedback

- Strong preference for in-person communication (90%), followed by calls and email; very low interest in social media.
- Most say they can always check grades and attendance.
- Identify English instruction as the top family need, followed by legal services for immigrants and food/clothing support.

Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities



Beacon Heights ES will continue to offer culturally relevant field trips, after-school programs, and summer learning opportunities that connect academic learning to real-world experiences.
