


### What did we learn?



- Students want more opportunities to engage in sports, recreational activities, after-school clubs, as well as field trips.
- Various student groups indicated interest in more outdoor time during school hours and food/snacks as incentives.
- Interest in more advanced courses (i.e. English and Math), as well as additional world classical language options.

They also indicated a desire for more homework help and hands-on learning.



- Teachers and staff agree students need support with reading, math, science, and social studies.
  - Social, emotional, and behavioral support, as well as access to community resources.
- Staff acknowledged enrichment partners (e.g., Science Guys) and the need to integrate instruction with enrichment. Staff suggested more alignment between enrichment and instructional goals.

- Families want more opportunities for students to socialize through academic enrichment, sports, culture and art exploration, field trips, etc.
- Parents were looking for more afterschool and before school care.
  - · Academic supports such as tutoring.
- More opportunities for families to learn english
- Access to healthy foods and opportunities to stay active as a family.



### Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities



- Increase student access to engaging, real-world learning (more field trips, hands-on projects)
- Strengthen alignment between in-school and out-of-school learning opportunities
- Expand access to enrichment for all grade levels

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice

- Increase family awareness and participation in leadership
- Translate PLO outreach for multilingual and non multilingual families
- Formalize structures for shared decision-making

Integrated Systems of Support



- Expand access to daily mental health services
- Normalize seeking emotional support (esp. for students)
- Strengthen Tier 1 & 2 behavior supports
