


What did we learn?



Student Feedback

- Over 90% felt welcome to the school
- Many students identified a need for more support in reading, writing, and math.



Staff Feedback

- Staff acknowledge importance of family engagement but language barrier makes it difficult to share voice
- Staff report using some whole-school strategies but gaps exist in individualized supports.

Family Feedback

- Families identified major needs in health (doctor, dental, vision), food insecurity (40.8%), and access to clothing, transportation, and after-school care
- a majority felt the school held PTO meetings and resource related events



Community Feedback

- Partners appreciated being included in decision making and would like to be invited to more events
- Open to expanding some of their programming to fill the gaps in need

Priorities and Opportunities

Increase access to expanded learning, especially for smaller groups of students and improve communication about availability of support services; while using a broader variety of communication channels

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice



Expand communication strategies to include digital platforms; create more structured opportunities for student and family voice in school planning

Integrated Systems of Support



Improve staff awareness of family needs and available supports; build clearer, more visible systems of referral and services for students and families.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



Strengthen SEL and mental health supports; provide culturally responsive training; enhance monitoring and response to students at risk.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement

Increase student awareness of tools to monitor progress (e.g., attendance); streamline family communication across platforms; support regular family student and staff interactions.
