


### What did we learn?



Student Feedback

- Majority of students believe that they could sometimes or always get extra help with learning and schoolwork.
- A third of students did not know if there was someone at school who could help with hearing, vision and seeing a dentist if needed.



### Staff Feedback

 Most school staff reported that supports for students struggling with attendance, behavior, and academics came in the form of whole-school programs.

### Family Feedback

- Majority of families believe they can get their student help with behavioral problems if needed.
- Close to a third of families stated they can easily check student(s) grades.
- More than 85% of families stated that they can easily check their student's attendance.

## Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities

- **Before- and After-School Programs:** Offer academic support, arts, technology, and recreation beyond the regular day.
- Whole-Child Focus: Align programs with students' social-emotional, physical, and creative development.
- **Equitable Access:** Ensure all students, especially those furthest from opportunity, can participate in enrichment.

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice



- Ensure diverse representation (racial, linguistic, socioeconomic) across all leadership bodies.
- Regularly share school data, priorities, and decisions in accessible formats.
- Build relationships and trust between school staff, families, and community partners.

Integrated Systems of Support



- Address chronic absenteeism through home visits, incentives, and coordinated outreach—not just punitive measures.
- Use early warning systems to flag academic, attendance, or behavioral challenges.
- Emphasis on proactive, coordinated, and holistic support addressing academic, physical, social-emotional, and mental health needs.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



- Creating a warm, inclusive environment where every student, family, and staff member feels seen, valued, and supported.
- Celebrate diverse cultures, languages, and identities through curriculum, displays, and events.
- Use climate surveys, listening sessions, and empathy interviews to continuously improve the sense of belonging for all.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement  $\circ$ 



- Establishing and maintain shared leadership, mutual learning, and relationship-based partnerships that support student success and community well-being.
- Prioritize regular, meaningful communication and personal connections between families and school staff.
- Invite families to lead workshops, storytelling sessions, or cultural
