

What did we learn?





- Want more hands-on, real-world learning (e.g., field trips, college/career exposure). Feel current work is repetitive and not engaging.
- Want to feel more involved in shaping school life beyond events.

Family Feedback

- 63.3% reported that they could always get information on their students' grades.
- 80.1% reported that they could sometimes (53.4%) or always (26.7%) get extra help with learning and schoolwork if their student needed it.

Staff Feedback

- More than three-quarters reported that their schools have these supports for academics (80.0%), attendance (86.0%), and behavior (76.0%).
- 32.0% of school staff are unsure whether their schools have tools and/or processes for students struggling with mental health.
- 53.0% of school staff report that they frequently communicate to students and their families through email or other computer-based electronic communications, followed by 41.7% and 14.6% who report that they frequently communicate through telephone call and a learning management system.

Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunites = Increase instructional time for Math & ELA: Consider push-in support, small group instruction, and after school tutoring partnerships. Engage Students in Real-World Learning: Use project-based learning and culturally relevant curriculum to increase relevance and engagement.

Collaborative Leadership. Shared Power, and Voice



The Community Schools Coordinator, Professional School Counselor, and Mental Health Clinician will work in collaboration to ensure wrap around services are provided for students and families.

Integrated Systems of Support



Engage in co-hosting family workshops (financial literacy, digital safety, parenting teens). On-site pantry/closet support (e.g., food, hygiene, emergency clothing)

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



Recruit parent ambassadors to lead engagement efforts in underrepresented communities. Launch school-wide wellness challenges or health fairs.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement



Ensure all information sent to families is translated in various languages and that interpreters are present at all family engagement events. Collect ongoing feedback from families and students to ensure we are maintaining a high level of engagement.
